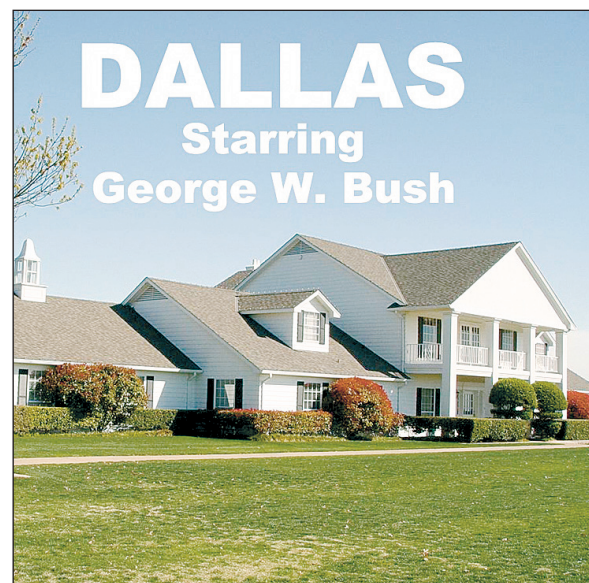
## Bill Clinton in Mayberry to seek release of Otis
